Our safeguarding policies and procedures are developed in line with the UK government's statutory guidance:

- Working Together to Safeguard Children

This national guidance sets out how organisations and professionals should work together to protect children and promote their welfare.

What This Means in Practice

Following this guidance means that Future Stars:

- Places the safety and wellbeing of children at the centre of everything we do
- Maintains clear safeguarding policies and procedures
- Ensures staff are trained to recognise and respond to safeguarding concerns
- Works with local safeguarding partners and statutory agencies where required
- Shares information appropriately where a child may be at risk of harm
- Takes all concerns about child welfare seriously

Working With Safeguarding Partners

Where safeguarding concerns arise, we may work with external agencies such as:

- Children's Social Care
- Police
- Health professionals
- Local safeguarding partnerships
- The Local Authority Designated Officer (LADO) for allegations involving adults working with children

This multi-agency approach helps ensure that children receive the protection and support they need.

Our Safeguarding Commitment

Future Stars is committed to creating a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment where children can learn, play, and develop with confidence.

All staff, coaches, volunteers, and franchise partners share responsibility for safeguarding and are expected to follow our safeguarding procedures at all times.
